Justice



The front cover of this leaflet illustrates our school's 15 Christian Values. We teach our pupils about these and emphasise that they are different from our Learning Values. These leaflets are for adults who may wish to know more about our Christian Values.

Our School Values can be found in writing near Maple Class and in practise they can be found underpinning all the work of our school.

We talk about 5 Christian Values per term in class and they are also reflected in our weekly Worship Themes.

The Christian Values are not separate but link together the beliefs of Christians. One is not more important than the other and therefore our leaflet cover represents them as interlocking building bricks of faith.

There are 15 leaflets with information about how each value defines itself in Christian faith.

Even if you choose not to be a Christian the leaflets may have information that helps you in your life's journey - or just makes you stop and reflect.

I hope that you find these leaflets helpful and informative.

Justice

When thinking about 'justice', some people think first about giving wrongdoers the punishment they deserve. However, that would be a one-sided picture of justice.

Justice also means giving all people - particularly the poor and oppressed, what it is right and fair for them to have: life, health, freedom and dignity.

It is about acting out of a concern for what is right and seeing right prevail. It is about social justice, especially for those who suffer most and are least able to protect themselves.

Throughout the Bible, it is emphasised that justice is immensely important to God. It is fundamental to God's character.

Justice is not about a culture which encourages everyone to insist on their own rights at the expense of others. It is about a community that knows that everyone's well-being is bound up with that of everyone else.

What do we do in school in response to Justice?

In school we learn about social justice and those that may be oppressed through our Global Learning and the United Nation's Convention on the Rights of the Child.



As a school we are proactive in raising money for Charities for those who do not have as much as we do.

In Collective Worship we discuss suffering in the world and how we can help.

We learn about Christians working for the rights of others and trying to make the world a better place - such as the Diocese support to Sierra Leone Schools.

We sponsor Assira Peruth in Uganda and this sponsorship helps her whole community.

Counting our Blessings is one of our Worship themes and this helps to remind us, that even in times of challenge, we still have more than many others.

Learning about what is fair and unfair and how to make choices helps us to understand that there are others who may need our help.
